Over the spring quarter, recruitment has really blossomed. So far this year, 23 different sites have recruited 74 participants to the trial, 45 in the last quarter alone. That's 12 more recruited participants than this time last year!

There were also a few records broken in the past couple of months:

Most randomisations in one week – 8 (was 7)

Highest number of different sites recruiting in one month – 15 (was 12)

Most number of randomisations in a quarter – 45 (was 43)

As always, thank you for continued effort on REVIVED, whether it is reminding your colleagues that we are still recruiting participants, re-evaluating your screening and recruitment process, and continuing to promote the study.

How REVIVED works at St George’s

The research team keeps a well-supported system in place by attending the Cardiac MDT meeting and liaising with the Multidisciplinary Cardiac Team on a daily basis in order to identify potentially eligible patients. We screen patients through electronic records and we actively involve the multidisciplinary care team before we make any decision. Patients identified as eligible passed by the PI and sub-investigators for final check. We approach patients in person, introduce the study to them using the patient information sheet, and we make sure they have all the information they need and all the help they require to make an informed decision that is best for them and their families.



Recruitment is a big challenge but we do not limit ourselves to one source of screening - we always explore new ways of increasing our numbers.

Favourite ice cream
